^{sp} Nowadays moral borders have disappeared, but fairy tales, legends and myths remind us about them and help us to decide whether it is wrong or right. The understanding of ¹⁰⁰ these rules of moral prevent us from losing our identity (it goes without saying that character is part of identity) when we are already formed human and help us to build our character when we are young. ¹¹⁰ The simplest example of this is that even in high school there are some fairy tales which are obliged to read. ¹¹⁵ The reason is that fairy tales help teenagers to form their world views.

^{sp} To sum up I can only add that often people forget some divine rules of life which are mentioned in fairy tales, legends and myths. ¹²⁰ So it is sometimes useful to spend your spare time with an interesting story reliving these rules.
