Raging Rhine

The Rhine is one of the longest and most important rivers in Europe. It is over 1,232 km long. Its source is in Switzerland and continues to flow through six countries in total before exiting into the North Sea. The river has been used for trade for many years, even as far back as the Roman era over 2,000 years ago. The river is still used for transporting goods today, and many towns have been built along the river to support the many businesses.
